1986 - The Synod approves broadening the nursing home ministry. North Carolina Lutheran Homes is renamed Lutheran Services for the Aging (LSA).

1991 - LSA opens its rental retirement community, Crescent View, in the Blue Ridge Mountains at Arden.

1993 - Trinity Oaks Retirement Community opens in Salisbury. With Lutheran Home at Trinity Oaks, the campus becomes LSA's first continuing care retirement community.

1994 - Abundant Living Adult Day Services, Salisbury, comes under the LSA umbrella.

2001 - Lutheran Home - Hickory West and Lutheran Home - Winston-Salem are acquired.
